

November 1, 2018 Program: Ray Didinger By Rich Shimko

When Ray Didinger was watching the Super Bowl victory celebration parade in Philadelphia, a fan showed him a photo of the fan and his father at the



game when the Eagles' won their last championship in 1960. The fan said he was sorry his father didn't live to see the Eagles' win another championship. Ray was also at the 1960 game with his father and grandfather. Ray said he saw his grandfather cry when the Eagles won, which was the first time he ever saw him do so.



Ray realized the Eagles' victory had ramifications beyond a mere football game victory. Among other things, such as on a city's pride in itself, it also allowed a father and son to have a shared memory. Fathers

and sons being the way they are, this could be a rare thing. Unfortunately, since the Super Bowl was not in Philadelphia, not as many Philadelphians attended the 2018 game as the 1960 game. Maybe more individuals will have a memory of the parade since Ray said it was watched in person by over two million people.

Ray's new book, *The Eagles' Encyclopedia, 3rd Edition*, had to be completed very quickly after the Super Bowl to have it on the market for the 2018 season. He said he wrote 60,000 words in about a month. It is out and available for purchase at the College bookstore.
