respectful of the feelings of the recipients of their help. Zoe is now a college freshman at Davidson College and Jonathan is a senior at Strath Haven High School.



As most of us are aware, ASP is a service project where teens and adults volunteers to travel to Appalachia to help homeowners with home repairs. Zoe and Jonathan were joined in the presentation by two adult volunteers – David Florence of the Swarthmore Presbyterian Church, and Linton Stables. Linton commented on how enthusiastic the teens were about doing the repair work. He said many thought the work was "cool". The trip this summer was Zoe's third ASP project. She related that before the first trip her father gave her lessons on using a hammer. As women are wont to do, she said Jonathan's hammering ability was much better



than hers. I should note that although the Swarthmore Methodist and Presbyterian churches are the primary sponsors of the ASP trips, Swarthmore Rotary

has provided support through grants.
