3/28/19 - Media Rotarian Ryan Martin's talk about the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) included both praise and controversy. First, Ryan, the Director of the Boy Scouts district that includes the Swarthmore troop, praised Kathryn Jones because her Scout troop has had one of the

highest growth rates of any troop in the District. He also praised her efforts to help grow the Chester troop. Ryan then discussed the BSA's recent decision to admit girls. He explained that most scout troops are setting up separate (but equal) groups for boys and girls. He said busy parents liked being able to take both their boy and girl scouts to the meetings at the same time, if that is how the troops arrange their schedules. He also said that although the boys and girls groups are separate, some troop activities are combined,

The Boy Scouts of America includes the following (from scouting.org)

<u>Cub Scouting</u> = Youth grades K–5, groups of Dens (Lion, Tiger, Wolf, Bear, Webelos) divided by grade and gender; Packs are made of multiple Dens and are Co-Ed.

Scouts BSA = Youth 11–17 years old, separate Troops for Boys and Girls each with their own leadership opportunities.

<u>Venturing</u> Co-ed 14–20 years old: A-L-P-S: Adventure, Leadership, Personal Growth, Service.

<u>Sea Scouting</u> Co-ed 14–20 years old; promote better citizenship and improve members' boating skills through instruction and practice in water safety, boating skills, outdoor, social, service experiences, and knowledge of our maritime heritage.

Exploring Co-ed 10–20 years old; activities and one-on-one mentorship for youth looking to discover their future.

#### The Foundation of Scouting;



**Scout Law**: A Scout is trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean, and reverent.

**Scout Mission**: The mission of the Boy Scouts of America is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Scout Law.
