

International Service Update

Ray Hopkins reported on his recent trip to Belize accompanied by incoming Springfield club president Nils Nelson.

The team of Rotarians, including Sherri and Aki Fukai from the San Ignacio club, and Living Waters for the World (LWW) found the situation in Yalbac

working perfectly except for the small scale of use, explored five other sites for possible water projects - Arenal, Los Tombos, Selena, and two institutions -Octavia Waight and the planned pre-school at San Antonio.

A day was spent reviewing and participating in the food program at Cornerstone foundation for which the last \$5000 of the initial RI grant for water at Yalbac was dedicated. Anne Hansen will get the details of the capital outlays for this last tranche. The program for which our funds went seems an excellent one - targeting at risk youth in school without stigmatizing them and delivering hot meals and weekly food rations to elderly and handicapped adults in desperate circumstances (120 children and 17 adults are served roughly).

Ray also reported on other cooperative actions with Rotary there. The \$1000 to the San Antonio pre-school from a past year will be used for small tables for break out education in the two 21 student sessions (the pre-school charges per pupil are \$45 per year including snacks and supplies - so it needs funds for many things); the Jump Start pre-school program at Cornerstone to which President Betty Ann committed \$1500 in a conference call last week, and elements of a large education RI/Corporate foundation/GOB funded project for teacher training. This is headed by SI club member and ex-district governor Andre Lopez who outlined special holes that needed to be plugged, including use of IT in schools. Incoming President Bill Butcher who is from the Philadelphia area looks forward to exchanges with incoming President Marv Gelb.

Rotary Foundation Thought

This week's Rotary Foundation Thought is about the Rotary Peace and Conflict Studies Program (RPCS) – strengthening the leaders of today for peace.

Mid-career professionals from around the world, representing a wide variety of fields, participate in an intensive three month course at Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok, Thailand. RPCS Program alumnus Richelieu Allison, Regional Director of the West African Youth Network, says, "This course has been the missing link in my [ability] to contribute to the resolution of the numerous problems confronting my region. If I had had the knowledge I am gaining now I would have been in a better position to adequately analyze the conflicts, map out the various actors, go the extra mile, and play a major role in helping to restore peace."

This sentiment has stuck with him, as he wrote in a recent email, "The changes [the program] made in my life cannot be overemphasized." Create awareness. Take action. Make your annual gift today!
