George Strimel

George Strimel, General Manager, at Radnor Studio 21, spoke to us about the station's mission and the state of public access television in general.

There are over 5000 Public Access stations across the country and George walks the walk when it comes to freedom of speech, giving free access to the airwaves through his station.

His station, like most public access channels is run mostly by volunteers and operates on a lean budget. It is challenging but rewarding at the same time

George, a polio survivor who was moved by our "happy dollars" that go for polio eradication, said "if you have something to say" he gives you the place. They have 42 programs a week and are on the air 24/7.

This Day in History

1861: First Federal Income Tax

On this day in 1861, Lincoln imposes the first federal income tax by signing the Revenue Act. Strapped for cash with which to pursue the Civil War, Lincoln and Congress agreed to impose a 3 percent tax on annual incomes over \$800.

According to the U.S. Treasury Department, the comparable minimum taxable income in 2003, after adjustments for inflation, would have been approximately \$16,000.

Congress repealed Lincoln's tax law in 1871, but in 1909 passed the 16th Amendment, which set in place the federal income-tax system used today. Congress ratified the 16th Amendment in 1913.
