Swarthmore Rotary Attends Foundation Seminar by Brian Casey

On Saturday October 1, Swarthmore Rotarians Anne Hansen, Will Fairley, Craig Fava and Brian Casey attended the Rotary Foundation Seminar in King of Prussia. Roughly 200 Rotarians from District 7450 and 7430 attended the Seminar which covered a variety of topics such as Foundation Basics, Leveraging Your Club's Funds, Keeping your Coffers Full, and District Simplified.

The Featured Speaker was Lt. D.F. Pace of the Philadelphia Police Department who returned from Bangkok, Thailand in September after completing a 3 month Fellowship at Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok on Peace and Conflict Resolution. This fellowship, a Rotary Foundation Program, is held at 6 universities around the world.

Lt. Pace described the program and told how his experience in the program is already changing how he looks at conflict resolution and prevention in his work with the Police department.

Swarthmore Rotary Provides Assistance for Sonestown PA Flood Victims

Following an emergency meeting of the Grants Committee last Thursday, the Swarthmore Rotary Board approved a grant of \$1000 to provide assistance to flood victims in the town of Sonestown, PA following the recent severe flooding in the area.

Friday morning Gladys Snively called the American Legion Sonestown Post 601, coordinators of the relief effort, to get a sense of the immediate needs of the families. Anne Hansen spent much of her Friday purchasing the water, cleaning supplies, trash bags, charcoal and coffee they requested

On Sunday October 2, Swarthmore Rotarians Gladys Snively and Anne Hansen made the 31/2 hour drive to deliver the needed supplies. They found the situation somewhat improved. Although the American Legion Auxiliary is still feeding victims on a daily basis, electricity is partially restored and some families are ready to move back into their homes.




Foundation Committee Seeks Support Based on Rotarian's **Capability to Pay**
