

Last Week's Speaker: Mark Kuperberg


Mark Kuperberg, Swarthmore College Economics professor, updated us on "The Great Recession---3 1/2 Years and Counting". He showed charts which confirmed the intractable employment and subpar growth problems.

Kuperberg then showed the impact on the economy from the "overwhelming force" that fiscal and monetary policies had on the economy----they brought us back from the brink but have not put us on a sustainable track. He is not optimistic and suggests that those seeking solutions should check out the New America Foundation's paper "The Way Forward" (http://newamerica.net/publications/policy/the_way_forward) by Daniel Alpert, Robert Hockett, and Nouriel Roubini.


