"The one that says: "childhood is the best part of life", is because never did an exchange program" This quote from a Brazilian author explains perfectly what I am feeling like lately.

My exchange program has been an amazing experience for me. I did more things in the last 5 months than I did in 16 years: I went to

New York 3 times, where I saw "The Rockettes", "The Jersey boys", Times Square, Central Park, Metropolitan Museum of NY, Natural museum of art and a lot of restaurants; I went to Philadelphia a couple of times and I ran on the Rocky's stairs, I also learned all the history of that place in a visit with Ann Seidmann, my

Another Chapter Written in our Literacy Efforts By Brian Casey



This initiative supports the Pennsylvania "One Book Every Child" program and will put a copy of the book "Stop Snoring Bernard" in the hands of over 850 pre-school children in the area.
