Last Week's Speaker: Fred Catona by Mike Malone

Fred Catona, Founder and CEO of Bulldozer Digital and the creator of "Taste of Philadelphia" (packages of Philly favorites), discussed how direct response radio led to the success of Priceline.com and his role in consulting with Priceline's founder about the use of radio advertising. According to Catona, despite new technologies, radio is still the best source of strong customer leads. He said the

key to success is to be in the right place at the right time with a unique situation. An effective ad needs words that excite people not ones that want to make them escape. Catona's company website is bulldozerdigital.com.



But – there was much more. RI President Kalyan Banerjee mentioned water and sanitation projects frequently during his speeches and endorsed the need for these essentials to life and health and their prominence as a Rotary key "Area of Focus".

As always the Wasrag booth was a hive of activity. So many people wanted to talk about their WASH projects and how "The Wasrag Model" can be utilized to help them. Especially notable this year was the emphasis on sanitation which, until now, has not received as much attention as it should. Rotarians are eager to learn more about sanitation. Wasrag has taken note and will be expanding its focus on this and the related hygiene issues.

Wasrag volunteers were kept busy signing up new members, answering a constant stream of questions and explaining the details of Wasrag's mandate. A special "thank you" here to Alan Watson, Sandra Forster and Stew Martin for their help at the booth and for helping us acquire almost 100 new members for Wasrag.

During the convention Wasrag held its Annual General Meeting. The minutes will be available shortly on the Wasrag website. And, the Chair's Report to the AGM is already available there (link).

Wasrag members especially will be interested to hear the results of the ballot for Wasrag's directors. Voting this year focused on filling two Board positions to represent North America. Jim Goodrich was re-elected to a second three-year term.
