# Last Week's Speaker—Charles Cresson, Jardiniere Extraordinaire, by Jim Leming

Charles Cresson has a belief that gardens are an important component of our quality of life, and he has acted on that belief for much of his own life. In founding the Swarthmore Horticultural

Society in 2002, he sought to leverage a trust fund set up by his father to plant flowers in public places, with volunteers providing the labor. Thus was born SHS, which started with just a few volunteers caring for 3 gardens, and has grown into a well-organized operation that maintains 11 public gardens with the help of some 100 volunteer members. The SHS gardens – found at Gateway Park, Centennial Park, Alex's Garden at the Post Office, the Co-Op flower bed, the Clock Tower garden, the War Memorial garden, and 5 gardens adjacent to Borough Hall – beautify Swarthmore and greatly enhance our quality of life. Charles thanked the Rotary Club for its support of SHS, and the club, in turn, applauded his dedication.
