Swarthmore architects Tim Kearney and Claudia Cueto, along with homeowner Cathy D'Ignazio, were on hand to describe the "Net Zero House" renovation recently completed at 307 Dartmouth Avenue. Using "Passive House" principles, they

created an extremely well-insulated, nearly air-tight, sunlight-capturing space that is so easily heated by the sun, body heat, and by-products of electrical appliances that the only "system" needed is an "Energy Recovery Ventilator." No furnace, no air conditioner. The ERV brings in fresh air from the outside, exchanging the temperature of the inside air as it does so – and uses the energy equivalent of only a 55 watt light bulb. Tim estimated that the cost of this renovation was perhaps 10-20% more than it would have been using current standard methods, but they will be tracking the savings over time, which is expected to include saving 90% of heating and cooling costs. Cathy noted that a geothermal system (another "green" alternative) is hugely expensive by comparison, costing \$50,000 upfront just to install.

RI President-elect Ron Burton will ask Rotarians to Engage Rotary, Change Lives in 2013-14. He unveiled the RI theme during the opening plenary session of the 2013 International Assembly in San Diego,

California, USA, the annual training event for incoming district governors.

"If we really want to take Rotary service forward, then we must make sure that every single Rotarian has the same feeling about Rotary that each one of us here has today," Burton said. "We need to make sure that every Rotarian has a meaningful role to play, that they're all making a contribution, and that their contribution is valued."

Burton said the July launch of The Rotary Foundation's new grant model, Future Vision, makes it an exciting time to be a Rotarian. "It takes everything that is wonderful about Rotary and raises it to a new level - by encouraging bigger, more sustainable projects while providing increased flexibility for local projects, both of which address the needs of the community being served," he said.

Bill Gates speaks of world's difficult fight to eradicate polio From the January 29, 2013, issue of The Guardian

Bill Gates has given a lecture in London in which he described the battle to eradicate polio as one of the most difficult tasks the world has ever faced, describing the effort as "a test" for the human race.

Delivering this year's Richard Dimbleby lecture, Gates revealed the fight against the disease was the project he dedicated most of his time to. "Most people in developed countries know of polio as a disease that used to paralyse lots of children. But it's not just a historical curiosity - it still strikes children today," he said.

"We are working to wipe the virus off the face of the earth, and we have almost succeeded. The best of who we are - our capacity for innovation, our resilience, our sympathy for each other - has gotten us to this threshold. Only disease, poverty and indifference still stand in the way. The fight to eradicate polio is a proving ground, a test. Its outcome will reveal what human beings are capable of, and suggest how ambitious we are about our future."

"Vaccines are a miracle tool. They prevent disease from striking, which is better than treating it after the fact. They are also relatively cheap and easy to deliver. However, millions and millions of children don't get them. This is still stunning to me," he said. Gates concluded his lecture, delivered at the Royal Institution, by calling for the implementation of a "detailed plan" to eradicate polio by 2018.
