Last Week's Speaker— Carolyn Pouncy By Joy Charlton

Carolyn is an accomplished scholar of Russian history, specializing in the 16th century. She has pursued this interest and shared her knowledge by established academic means and also by writing historical fiction; in the process she is creating an internet publishing venture.

Carolyn translated The Domostroi: Rules for Russian Households in the Time of Ivan the Terrible, a compendium of detail about Russian daily life which serves as a continuing resource for historians. She is currently managing editor of Kritika: Explorations in Russian and 3. Will it build GOOD Eurasian History. Carolyn has most recently channeled her creative and scholarly energies into writing historical novels under the name C.P. Lesley. The Not Exactly Scarlet Pimpernel is a contemporary adventure, a re-writing of the original classic tale. The Golden Lynx is the first in a series that features a 16 year-old female protagonist of mid-16th century Russia who finds herself a decisive player in the midst of major political change.

Publishing has changed tremendously as traditional publishers have contracted and the number of self-published e-books has exploded. Carolyn and a group of colleagues are creating an "imprint" of e-books called "Five Directions Press." Interestingly, e-books generate more royalties for authors because there are fewer physical costs. Carolyn's books can be found on cplesley.com as well as via popular booksellers.
