This Week's Speakers: ABC House, Strath Haven

Lori Foglio, President of the Board of the ABC House program, Strath Haven, joined us with three ABC House students for an update. The program has consolidated their two houses into

one, the former Boys House on Harvard Avenue. This has required extensive renovation on the second floor into two separate parts for 4 male students and the other for 4 female students, plus a resident tutor for each. The program is running a capital campaign to help pay for this plus a new heating system, insulation, new windows. The ABC House is proud of its 109 graduates thus far, and introduced us to Gabrielle Thomas, a current resident tutor who graduated from SHHS '09 and Tufts University '13, and to two SHHS seniors, Bryce Mitchell and Doyinsola Oladipo. All three spoke of how The ABC House became family to them, while providing much appreciated structure, support, and new experiences.

Rotary President Ron D. Burton - Recruit New Members or Risk Extinction

CHERRY HILL The president of Rotary International issued a direct challenge to local members over the weekend: Recruit new people or risk extinction. "I believe in tradition, but sometimes you need change," said Ron Burton, whose group is one of the world's largest

humanitarian service organizations. "We've got to take a look at who we are and ask if we want to be relevant or even in existence in the years to come." Burton spoke at the Rotary Leadership Institute of North America held in Cherry Hill over the weekend. The institute trains and graduates new leaders of the club in two of 34 zones, which cover parts of the Northeastern United States, Bermuda, Russia, Canada, and some French islands.

The convention was buzzing with displays celebrating the success of current Rotary projects, from Sandy relief efforts to international aid for Syrian refugees, but Burton's message Saturday was engagement and membership.

"You've got to find those people and invite them in," he told about 300 people at the lunchtime address. "Mentor them and find a reason to keep them, to get them excited and involved."

Burton, a lawyer from Norman, Okla., and a Rotarian since 1979, is a retired president of the University of Oklahoma Foundation. In his one-year term leading the club, he says, his main focus is membership, which includes youth involvement through programs in elementary schools, high schools, and colleges.



Indian
philanthropist
boosts Rotary's
push to end polio
with new
US\$1 million gift

Indian philanthropist and businesswoman Rajashree Birla has announced a new gift of US\$1 million to Rotary to help eradicate polio. The gift brings her total contributions to the Rotary effort to more than \$7.2 million. What's more, this gift will be matched two-for -one by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, resulting in \$3 million in new funding for the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI). Rotary is a leading partner in the GPEI, especially in advocating government and donor support, fundraising, and building public awareness. Through the End Polio Now: Make History Today fundraising campaign, the Gates Foundation is matching two-for-one every new dollar Rotary commits to polio eradication, up to \$35 million per year, from 2013 through 2018.

Birla's gift underscores India's commitment to remain polio free. India -- which some experts believed would be the last nation to beat polio -- hasn't recorded a case of the disease since January 2011.
