

Charles Morgan was a 19<sup>th</sup> century industrialist who lived in Massachusetts for the most part (WOOS-tuh again) but lived in Philadelphia for four years (1861-1865). While in Philadelphia he and his brother made paper bags, then a new product. I was thinking it is noteworthy how similar his story is to entrepreneurs of today. He started his company with money from family and friends as seed capital. He had good ideas which he patented. Early on he had to go through several patent fights, which seems to be a common element of every person who tries to commercialize a new product. Finally, success. He expanded the business into other areas, specifically construction and milling. At the end of his life he donated money to philanthropic causes, including founding Worcester Polytechnic Institute. 150 years later he might have invented the iPhone.

Finally, my ears perked up when our El Presidente for Life stated Cheston had served him goat curry. Perhaps eating goat will become a president's club tradition to which Perri and Joe can look forward.


