Joseph Callahan, our speaker, was introduced as the CEO of Ciright One and as an expert on the "Internet of Things". He said Philadelphia is the location of the first hospital, stock exchange, and computer. Although innovation is commonly perceived as a young persons' game, Joseph said these youngsters need guidance from more experienced individuals. He may have been tailoring his message to his audience.

Joseph was asked what he thought was the "next big thing". His answer: embedded body monitors, the use of virtual reality in education, and more use of voice and motion to replace touch controls.
