Rotary wins Best Nonprofit Act for its polio eradication work

Rotary's commitment to eradicating polio worldwide won Best Nonprofit Act in the **Hero Awards** of the One Billion Acts of Peace campaign, an international global citizens' movement to tackle the world's most important issues.

The campaign is an initiative of PeaceJam Foundation and is led by 14 Nobel Peace Prize laureates, including the Dalai Lama, Desmond Tutu, and Rigoberta Menchú Tum, with the ambitious goal of inspiring a billion acts of peace by 2020.

Each year, the campaign picks two finalists in each of six categories for their work to make a measurable impact in one of the 10 areas considered most important by the Nobel laureates. Winners are chosen by people from around the world.

Rotary and Mercy Corps were the two finalists in the

Best Nonprofit Act category. Rotary and the five other winners will be recognized at a ceremony on June in Monaco. Betty Williams, who won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1977 for her advocacy for peace in Northern Ireland, will present the award.

She gave the example of a math textbook which cost \$196 new as a print version, being offered by the bookstore in the following formats: used \$143, rent new \$126, rent used \$73, digital \$43. She said over half the students read textbooks on their cellphones. The bookstore's other strategy is obvious to anyone walking through – most of the space is not given to books but to gifts, greeting cards, souvenirs, and the like. These products are how the bookstore makes money. I miss the old bookstores, but as an Amazon customer, I have only myself to blame.
