Last Meeting Summary



Kevin Skoglund of Citizens for Better Elections discussed actions underway in Pennsylvania to ensure the accuracy of the 2020 election. There has been much talk recently of groups subverting the voting process, for example, by hacking into voting machines to change the count. Kevin

said Pennsylvania Governor Wolf issued a directive requiring that all voting machines have a paper trail in order to be able to audit elections. There is no way to audit the voting machines currently being used in Delaware County.

Kevin said there are two types of voting machines being offered by voting machine vendors. He said his group recommends the simpler and cheaper type of machine. That type is the one that Delaware County has selected. He said Philadelphia went with the more expensive type of voting machine and that decision is now being challenged in court by his group and others. Rotarians asked a lot of questions, partly because a number of Rotarians are involved in the conduct of the vote in various functions. To summarize some of the answers: Kevin didn't think the voting will take appreciably longer with the new machines; the new voting systems have provisions for handicapped voters; his group considers absentee ballots for everyone and on-line voting to be bad options. Hopefully, these modifications will help Americans continue to have faith in our voting system.

When asked for a highlight of her Rotary membership, Betty Ann Flynn immediately responded "starting Happy Dollars at Swarthmore Rotary." It's not as though she doesn't have a great deal to be proud of as a Rotarian. Betty Ann was President of both the Media and Swarthmore Rotary clubs. She was Assistant Governor to the District as well as being on the Boards of the District and both clubs. In spite of these accomplishments, she is most pleased that Swarthmore Rotary accepted her idea of Happy Dollars and has kept it up ever since. Betty Ann recognized that Happy Dollars is a way to bring members of the club community closer together by sharing personal information such as our latest trips or the accomplishments of our children, while helping to eradicate polio.

Betty Ann joined the Media Rotary club in 1990. She transferred to Swarthmore Rotary in 2005 because she was disenchanted with the leadership at Media Rotary. She asked Ken Wright and Marty Spiegel if she could join the Swarthmore Rotary Club; their reply "in a New York Minute". Betty Ann, while she was President, started an auction with the help of Mary Gelb, Steve Laxton and Brian Casey. The auction ran for two years and cleared as much as \$12,000. The club decided to discontinue the auction and focus on Fun Fair because the auction required an unrealistic amount of time and work.

Betty Ann was born and raised in Media and has lived there most of her life. After graduating from the University of Dayton she worked for BP Oil for a couple of years in Atlanta and then Port Arthur, Texas. She couldn't wait to get back to Media, describing Port Arthur as a "crazy town", and one that was violent. Upon returning to Media, Betty Ann decided to convert her hobby, photography, into a career. After obtaining an additional degree at the Philadelphia University of the Arts, Betty Ann started doing wedding photos. She succeeded in obtaining a contract with Sun Ship to photograph all their ships under construction. Since then she has focused on architectural and construction site photography. Her largest project was documenting the construction of the Pennsylvania Convention Center. This project lasted five years. In addition to photography, Betty Ann attended the University of Pennsylvania, receiving a certification in professional fund-raising.

According to Hillard, Betty Ann's dog, Biscuit, is the "cutest dog on the planet". Biscuit is a Bischon. Some of you may remember that Biscuit marched with Rotary in the 4th of July parade. Betty Ann's hobbies include golf "now and then", reading and watching the occasional movie and TV show. She prefers to read American history. A recent book was Steven Gillon's book on JFK Jr. She is interested in politics, following news in the New York Times, the New Yorker and Atlantic magazines.

Betty Ann has been a valuable asset to Rotary over the years and continues to serve in many roles, including being Treasurer of the Swarthmore Rotary Charitable Trust. Remember to give lots of Happy Dollars in her honor.
