Last Meeting Summary

New members to Rotary can find the different charitable funds confusing. I know I was confused when I first joined. There are three funds of which to be aware. The first is The Rotary Foundation (TRF). This fund is Rotary International's charitable foundation and solicits and distributes money globally. Barbara Whitaker-Shimko, Chair of the Rotary Foundation Committee, requests contributions to this fund every year.

The second fund is the Gundaker Foundation, which is our District's charitable organization.

Gundaker solicits and distributes money within our District.

The third fund is the Swarthmore Rotary Charitable Trust, which is controlled completely by our club. For the last several years, our club has not participated in Gundaker.

The Gundaker Foundation's President, Karen Mazzarella-Russo, and Treasurer, Dave Haradon, spoke to us about Gundaker. They said the Foundation makes four types of grants. The first type is matching grants of up to \$1,000 to District 7450 clubs' service projects. Gundaker usually distributes \$20,000 a year to clubs.

The second type of grant is vocational education scholarships of between \$1,000 to \$3,000 each. These go to students enrolled in vocational education programs such as automobile technology, licensed practical nursing, paramedics, and police academy. Gundaker awarded eight scholarships last year.

The third type of grant is support for the Youth Exchange program. Gundaker supports trips by visiting Youth Exchange students to New York City and Washington, D.C., and for recruitment of host families.

The last program was established in response to the Covid-19 crisis. The Gundaker Relief Emergency Assistance Team (GREAT) has donated \$50,000 for emergency response organizations such as food banks, shelters, and medical providers.

Karen and Dave spoke about how much Gundaker has improved in recent years and that they were hopeful that Swarthmore Rotary would join Gundaker.
