Association of Boroughs awarded her its Carol Sambol Award for being "an exceptional public servant." She earned the respect of all who knew her well and the full attention of anyone in the Borough who ever needed a permit. When Jane retires as Borough Manager next year (2022), she will have been the Borough's last manager of the 20th century and its first manager of the new century. To paraphrase a comment she made a few years ago, "thirty-two years is a lot of sewer blocks, police contracts and missed trash collections... You cannot find anyone luckier or happier than I to have had the job." Her retirement is a huge loss to the Borough, but we are fortunate to have had her working for us for these past many years.

#### Community Service Award:

The Community Service Award recipient for 2020-21 is the Swarthmore Senior Citizens Association. President Nancy Daniel and Past President Linton Stables accepted the award as representatives of the Association. The Swarthmore Senior Citizens Association is a civic organization whose activities are open to all who reside in Swarthmore and the surrounding communities. It promotes the well-being of seniors, as well as others in the community, by providing a welcoming environment for social interaction, learning opportunities, and a variety of activities and programs. SSCA has become an integral and active part of the Borough of Swarthmore. The Gathering Place at 129 Park Avenue was established as a center for groups to gather and play games, which include bridge, canasta and scrabble; work on crafts; meet for programs; and hold discussions. The Gathering Place is now coming back to life with in-person activities for those who have been fully vaccinated for COVID-19. Other programs sponsored by SSCA that bring people together include "Friday Friends", "Lunch and Learn" and "Walks and Trails", which gets people outside and walking around. SSCA also supports the Food Pantry at St. Katherine Drexel through its Pantry Staples Program. During the pandemic, the Association has been dedicated to keeping seniors healthy and engaged, and the work it has done this year has been astounding. They have had daily e-newsletters, which include updates about the virus, information about where vaccinations could be obtained, and interesting on-line activities. They have held two vaccination clinics, and virtual health and wellness fairs. They also do regular Zoom programing and social times.
