Last Meeting Summary

Professor Dominic Tierney of Swarthmore College told us the media has been focused on their views of the Administration's mistakes in the last month in Afghanistan. Unlike the media's view, his perception is that the United States started to make mistakes 75 years ago that led up to the recent events.

Professor Tierney's analysis follows.

The U.S. was the dominant world power after World War 2. The war changed the American psyche from being isolationist and inward-looking to being interventionist and having a missionary zeal to spread

democracy across the globe. Americans became united against a common enemy, communism. This combination led to interventions in Korea and Vietnam, one leading to a stalemate and the other to the U.S.'s defeat. After the fall of the Soviet Union, the perception of other "enemies" led to interventions in Iraq twice and in Afghanistan.

Unfortunately, the other "enemies" (cutoff of oil, WMD, and Islamic terrorism) failed to unify the American public to the extent that Russian communism had done. Without a common enemy, American political partisanship increased.

In the case of Afghanistan, Americans were shaken by 9/11 and wanted revenge. Among the Bush administration's mistakes was the lumping together of the group responsible for 9/11, Al Qaeda, together with the Taliban. The Taliban offered to negotiate with the U.S. and assume a minor role in the new Afghan government. The Bush administration would have none of it. They wanted to destroy the Taliban.

Professor Tierney went on to say that intervening in a civil war raises much different problems than conducting a war between two countries. In Afghanistan, as in Vietnam, the opposing side had the will and the time to outlast the U.S. military.

On a positive note, Professor Tierney said failure, as in Afghanistan, often causes a nation to reflect on what it is doing wrong. He hopes the U.S. has learned to avoid getting involved in civil wars where it does not understand the culture and does not have a vital interest.
