Last Meeting Summary



Delaware County Councilwoman Christine
Reuther's talk generated so many questions that
we ran out of time before they all could be
answered. Christine was part of the blue wave of
Democratic County Council candidates that
swept the Republicans out of power in 2020 for
the first time since 1875. Their campaign focused

on three issues: establish a county health department, return the

County prison to public control, and modernize the election process. She
took office right before Covid started. Although combating the
pandemic became the County government's priority, Christine said
progress was made on achieving all of the new administration's goals.

The County Public Health Department was established and is awaiting
State certification. The purpose of the new department is to take
coordinated actions to prevent illnesses. Even though the Department
was not completely operational, it took a leading role in organizing the
response to Covid. Christine said there were two main reasons that

Delaware County did not have a health department previously: money and money. First of all, establishing a new government department costs money. Secondly, some towns did not want to give up the fees they currently collect doing health inspections in homes and businesses. Christine believes public operation of the County prison will save money in the long run. More importantly, she believes that government should be control of prisons. Also, private companies should not make a profit from prisoners. Christine stated the County is working to reduce the number of individuals going to prison. She noted that a large portion of the prison population is those incarcerated for minor parole violations. Many of the inmates have mental illnesses and are non-violent. The County is working to divert some persons from going to prison when it would be better for society if they were managed in, for example, treatment centers.

The County modernized its election machines while having to handle a surge in mail-in ballot requests in 2020. The election this year has another problem. The redistricting maps for this election have not been finalized yet. This is preventing the preparation of the ballots for the primaries. If you requested a mail-in ballot, Christine warned that you might receive it very close to or after the mailing deadline. If that happens, she referred us to the County Board of Elections website for guidance.

The questions by Rotarians covered the topics of voting, 911 system modernization, and environmental sustainability and equality.

Christine ended her talk by stating that the County may need volunteer help from Rotarians and other individuals to administer the primary and
